conceived the book presents essays by leading international scholars on the contours of politics and culture in german american relations as well as broader traditions of cultural mediation topics range from current concerns about public policy and cultural diplomacy americanization and anti americanism to historical considerations of central european artists and writers who as public intellectuals had significant impact on the politics of culture after world war two and earlier

examines security theology surveillance and the industry of fear from the intimate spaces of everyday life in settler colonial contexts

this book is the first to explore street names and street naming in the formation of a greek cypriot identity in the cityscape of nicosia between 1878 and 1975 rather than treating toponymy as a direct linguistic act of spatial orientation the book approaches street naming as a contested practice involving those shared symbols and representations used to depict official history and collective identity as part of a political process it considers how street names are part of the symbolic politics of space and how authorities transformed the streets of nicosia into arenas of struggle for the control of symbolic and material space it documents historical efforts over the course of a century to impose a geography of forgetting to buttress national identity and to cast out the other from space both literally and symbolically so as to achieve territorial dominance and political legitimacy the book is another step towards the development of a global perspective on the critical study of street naming thereby refining and expanding our knowledge of the political dynamics involved in the process in their commemorative capacity street names belong to the politics of public memory and identity

in japan s nuclear disaster and the politics of safety governance florentine koppenborg argues that the regulatory reforms taken up in the wake of the fukushima disaster on march 11 2011 directly and indirectly raised the costs of nuclear power in japan the nuclear regulation authority resisted capture by the nuclear industry and fundamentally altered the environment for nuclear policy implementation independent safety regulation changed state business relations in the nuclear power domain from regulatory capture to top down safety regulation which raised technical safety costs for electric utilities furthermore the safety agency s extended emergency preparedness regulations expanded the allegorical backyard of nimby demonstrations antinuclear protests mainly lawsuits challenging restarts incurred additional social acceptance costs increasing costs undermined pronuclear actors ability to implement nuclear power policy and caused a rift inside the nuclear village small nuclear safety administration reforms were in fact game changers for nuclear power politics in japan koppenborg s findings contribute to the vibrant conversations about the rise of independent regulatory agencies crisis as a mechanism for change and the role of nuclear power amid global interest in decarbonizing our energy supply

what impact does un peacekeeping have on the politics of authoritarianism in host countries this book advances a theoretically innovative and empirically rich answer to this question while the un does not intentionally promote authoritarianism it faces a number of constraints and dilemmas that give rise to what we call authoritarian enabling enabling can occur through two mechanisms capacity building and the creation of a permissive environment which enhance the ability of host governments to engage in authoritarian behavior and signal to them that doing so is low cost this book illustrates these two mechanisms with four in depth case studies of un peacekeeping operations untac in cambodia monuc monusco in the democratic republic of congo minustah in haiti and unmil in liberia the analysis is based on primary interview data from over 200 interviews the authors explore the sources of enabling identifying the trade offs and contradictions that give rise to these two mechanisms they include respect for sovereignty the importance of working relations with the host government the tension between democracy and other mission goals the pressure to demonstrate quick results and divergences within missions and the broader international community while enabling stops short of the outright promotion of authoritarianism it explains why the un s activities often appear to contradict its stated objectives and the outcomes it delivers fall short of its goals in addition to its theoretical and empirical contributions the book suggests how these dilemmas and challenges can be overcome
